1. General Business

A. Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Hilgart called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

B. Approval of Agenda

Councilmember Gabler requested that discussion on residential speed limits be added to the agenda.

Motion by Councilmember Hinz to approve the agenda with the addition of discussion on residential speed limits. Councilmember Christianson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

C. Approval of Meeting Minutes

- Joint Workshop Minutes from December 15, 2025
- Special Meeting Minutes from January 12, 2026
- Regular Meeting Minutes from January 12, 2026

Motion by Councilmember Gabler to approve the meeting minutes. Councilmember Hinz seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Citizen Comments

The following spoke under citizen comments:

Scott Custforth, 8634 Fairhill LN. Mr. Custforth requested that the City address a broken elevator at the Deep Haven Apartments (1255 Edmonson Avenue) and also expressed concern about potential legal and financial impacts of a proposed data center. He added that Councilmember Christianson stated that there was a risk of being sued or putting the City at risk of bankruptcy due to not allowing a data center.

Councilmember Christianson clarified that his previous comments were intended to highlight the importance of establishing clear rules for evaluating development

applications, noting that without such rules, the City could face legal challenges that limit flexibility and create long-term financial burdens.

Bill Saville, 873 97th Street NW. Mr. Saville, a retired mechanical engineer, shared his knowledge of data centers and raised concerns about the proposed location and timing, citing traffic, power and water usage, and public safety. He noted potential conflicts with Monticello's long-term infrastructure and suggested the City consider locally owned, employee-focused business models to support community growth.

Jenna Vandenboom 4414 87th St. NE. She expressed concern about litigation being used as a scare tactic to allow data centers and that the City is vulnerable to these large companies. She also questioned whether a moratorium on the ordinance was an option.

Holly Newman, 840 Powell Street, Big Lake. Ms. Newman noted that her mom lived in Monticello and asked whether proposed ordinance is primarily motivated by fear of a lawsuit and suggested allowing smaller data centers.

Mayor Hilgart responded he his support for the ordinance is based on principle, not fear of litigation.

Ty Weiss, 714 E. 7th Street. Ms. Weiss expressed concerns that a proposed data center could strain the local power supply, especially during extreme weather events, potentially causing outages for residents while the data center remains operational using backup power. She also raised concerns about increased electricity costs due to peak usage and questioned the ability to fully predict or mitigate these impacts.

F. Council Liaison Updates

- **Economic Development Authority (EDA)** – Councilmember Hinz reported that at the January 14 EDA meeting, a professional services contract for the downtown small area proposal was authorized, and a Homeowner Rehabilitation Loan Program using the State Aid Housing Assistance Fund was approved.
- **Monticello Orderly Annexation Board (MOAA Board)** – Community Development Director Angela Schumann reported that the group reviewed ordinance amendments that were presented at the January 26 City Council meeting. They will not take action on these amendments until a public hearing is held.

G. Department Updates

- **Wright County Sheriff's Office Quarterly Update** – Sergeant McMackins, WCSO, presented the quarterly update.
- **Building Department Update** – Chief Building Official Bob Ferguson presented the annual update of the Building Department.
- **Wright County Economic Development Partnership – Partner of the Year Award.** Jim Thares, Economic Development Manager, presented the Partner of the Year Award that Monticello was awarded from the Wright County Economic Development Partnership.

Community Development Director Angela Schumann provided an overview of the Monticello Industrial Alternative Urban Areawide Review (AUAR) and Mitigation Plan, noting that it evaluates potential environmental impacts of a proposed technology campus and light industrial uses in the Monticello Orderly Annexation Area. She explained that the process included public and agency review and that adoption of the AUAR and Mitigation Plan will guide future planning, zoning, and environmental review. The AUAR is valid for five years and may be amended if development exceeds the scenarios analyzed.

Councilmember Gabler asked about the process if no development occurs within five years. Ms. Schumann stated the AUAR may be updated if conditions change or allowed to lapse, particularly if other development plans or significant changes occur.

Councilmember Hinz questioned the accountability related to the mitigation plan. Ms. Schumann noted that the AUAR identifies responsible parties for mitigation measures. As development proposals are reviewed, the City will ensure the mitigation plan is followed and that all environmental review requirements are addressed by the appropriate parties.

Motion by Councilmember Gabler to adopt Resolution 2026-02 adopting the Monticello Industrial Alternative Urban Areawide Review and adopt the Monticello Industrial Alternative Urban Areawide Review Mitigation Plan for a 550-acre industrial development study area including a light industrial scenario and a technology campus scenario that could include a data center and

appurtenant uses. Councilmember Christianson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Additional Items

Councilmember Gabler requested discussion on lowering residential speed limits, noting prior consideration in December 2020 and available engineering data for an updated review. The Council expressed no opposition, though Mayor Hilgart noted potential enforcement challenges. There was consensus of the City Council for staff to schedule a workshop to discuss residential speed limits.

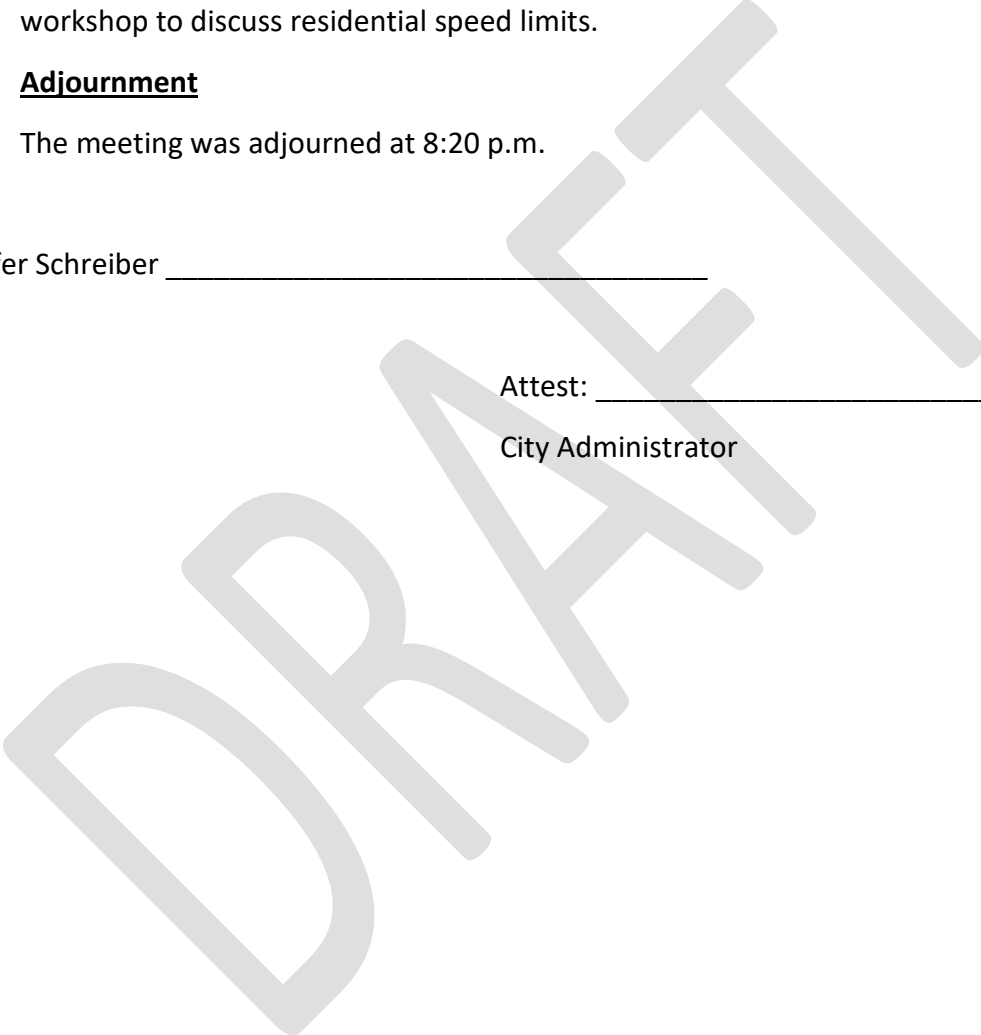

Motion to authorize Kids Haven of Monticello Holdings, LLC as the signatory applicant to the proposed Jefferson Commons Fifth Addition Preliminary and Final Plat and related land use actions for a 2.93-acre childcare facility development proposal on City-owned property while the purchase agreement is being finalized.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

In late 2025, the City Council considered an offer from the owners of Kids Haven to purchase 2.93 acres of City-owned property along School Boulevard near the Emagine Monticello movie theater. Council directed staff to prepare a purchase agreement to facilitate the sale of the site for development of a childcare facility. The draft purchase agreement and related documents are currently under review by the buyer’s legal counsel prior to bringing a final version forward for consideration by the City Council.

In the meantime, a complete land use development application has been received from Kids Haven of Monticello Holdings, LLC for their proposed 26,704 square-foot childcare center. The application submittal included:

- Site Plans
- Preliminary Plat
- Final Plat draft
- Landscape Plan
- Architectural Plans
- Lighting Plans
- Access Easement Exhibit for L1 B1 and Outlot G

- Access Easement Exhibit for Outlot A
- Drainage Analysis
- Storm Sewer Pipe Size Analysis
- Title Commitment L1 B1 and Outlot G
- Title Commitment Outlot C

Typically, City policy requires that an entity proposing a land subdivision hold vested property rights, either through fee title interests or a purchase agreement. However, Kids Haven of Monticello Holdings, LLC remains in the process of obtaining those rights.

To allow the development review process to proceed, staff request that the City Council authorize Kids Haven of Monticello Holdings, LLC to act as the signatory applicant for the proposed Jefferson Commons Fifth Addition Preliminary and Final Plat and related land use entitlements.

The proposed childcare facility is an estimated \$5,850,000 +/- development on a parcel to be created through the subdivision of the City-owned 7.01-acre Outlot C, Jefferson Commons. The proposed subdivision also identifies a remaining City-owned development parcel of 4.01 acres, designated as Outlot A. Staff review of the submitted land use application is currently underway, and Planning Commission consideration of the Preliminary and Final Plat and related land use actions is targeted for the March 3, 2026, meeting.

A business subsidy public hearing will also be required as part of the land sale consideration.

- I. **Budget Impact:** The budget impact related to this item is minimal.
- II. **Staff Workload Impact:** The Community Development Director and Economic Development Manager have committed time to completing early-stage review of land use entitlement application material and preparation of the land sale purchase agreement. Additional City staff will dedicate further time to advancing both items.
- III. **Comprehensive Plan Impact:** The Economic Development section of the Comprehensive Plan encourages formation of an effective economic development effort which creates a supportive business environment and builds a vibrant, thriving local economy.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend authorizing Kids Haven of Monticello Holdings, LLC as the signatory applicant to the proposed Jefferson Commons Fifth Addition Preliminary and Final Plat and related land use considerations while the purchase agreement is being finalized.

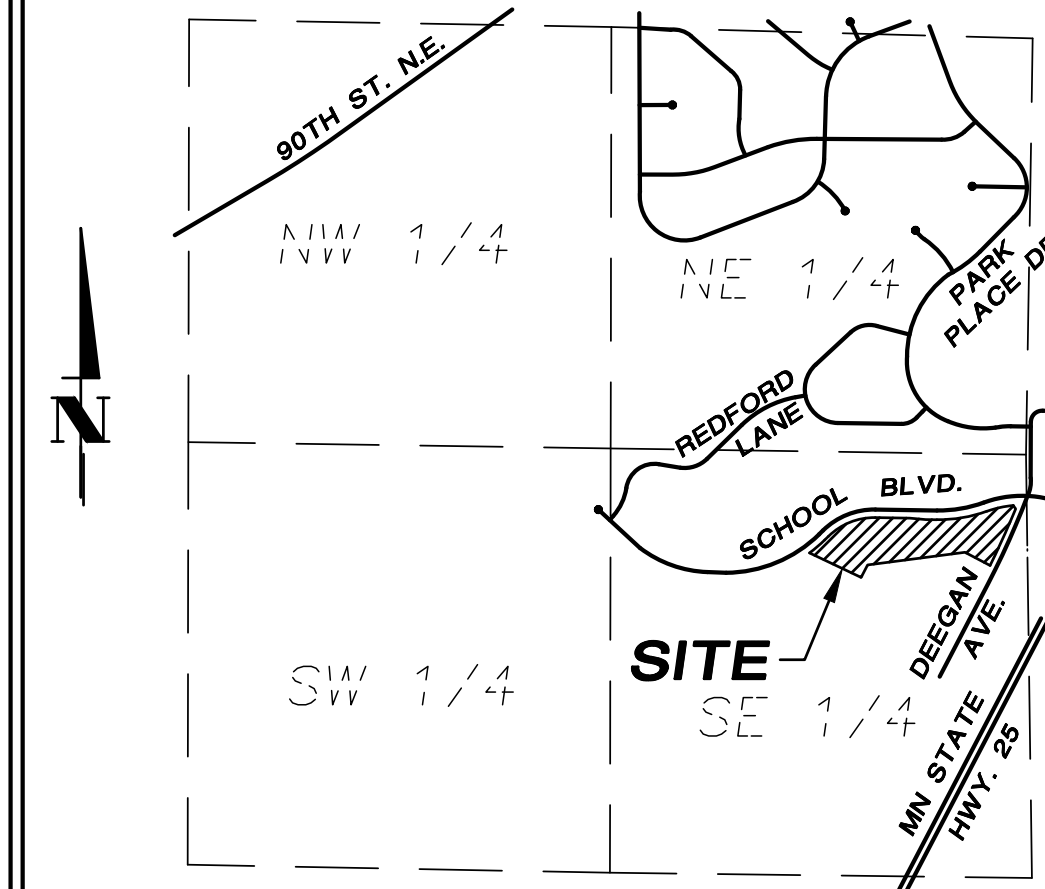

Motion to approve the final 2025 Operating Transfers.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

Operating transfers shift money from one fund to another. This is done for a variety of reasons, including to:

- repay debt
- cover unanticipated operating expenditures
- close city funds that are no longer needed or open new funds
- finance city projects

The transfers listed as items a – e were anticipated and authorized when the council adopted the 2025 budget resolution 2024-127. However, some items were approved at estimated amounts and staff request to adjust the approved transfers as needed. Transfer e) is a shift in Council strategy by allowing net profits from the liquor store to build up in that fund until a specific project is identified for use of that funding rather than transferring available funding to the Capital Projects Fund annually.

Transfer f) reflects the closure of the Park & Pathway Improvement Fund into the Capital Projects Fund. Capital projects for recreational activities have historically been paid for out of the Park & Pathway Improvement Fund with funding from grants and/or transfers from the Capital Project Fund’s tax levy or reserves. To streamline recording of these projects, staff recommend closing the Park & Pathway Improvement Fund and using the Capital Projects Fund instead, which is how most non-recreational capital projects are accounted for. The city’s Park Dedication Fund, which is funded by contributions from developers restricted to new recreational improvements, still remains a separate funding mechanism for eligible capital projects.

Transfer g) from the General Fund to the Capital Projects Fund reflects a funding strategy to match favorable budget-to-actual results, which are non-recurring in nature, to non-recurring expenditures in the Capital Projects Fund.



REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

Now in its seventh year, the MontiArts Glow Fest has grown from a small gathering into a highly anticipated annual event. 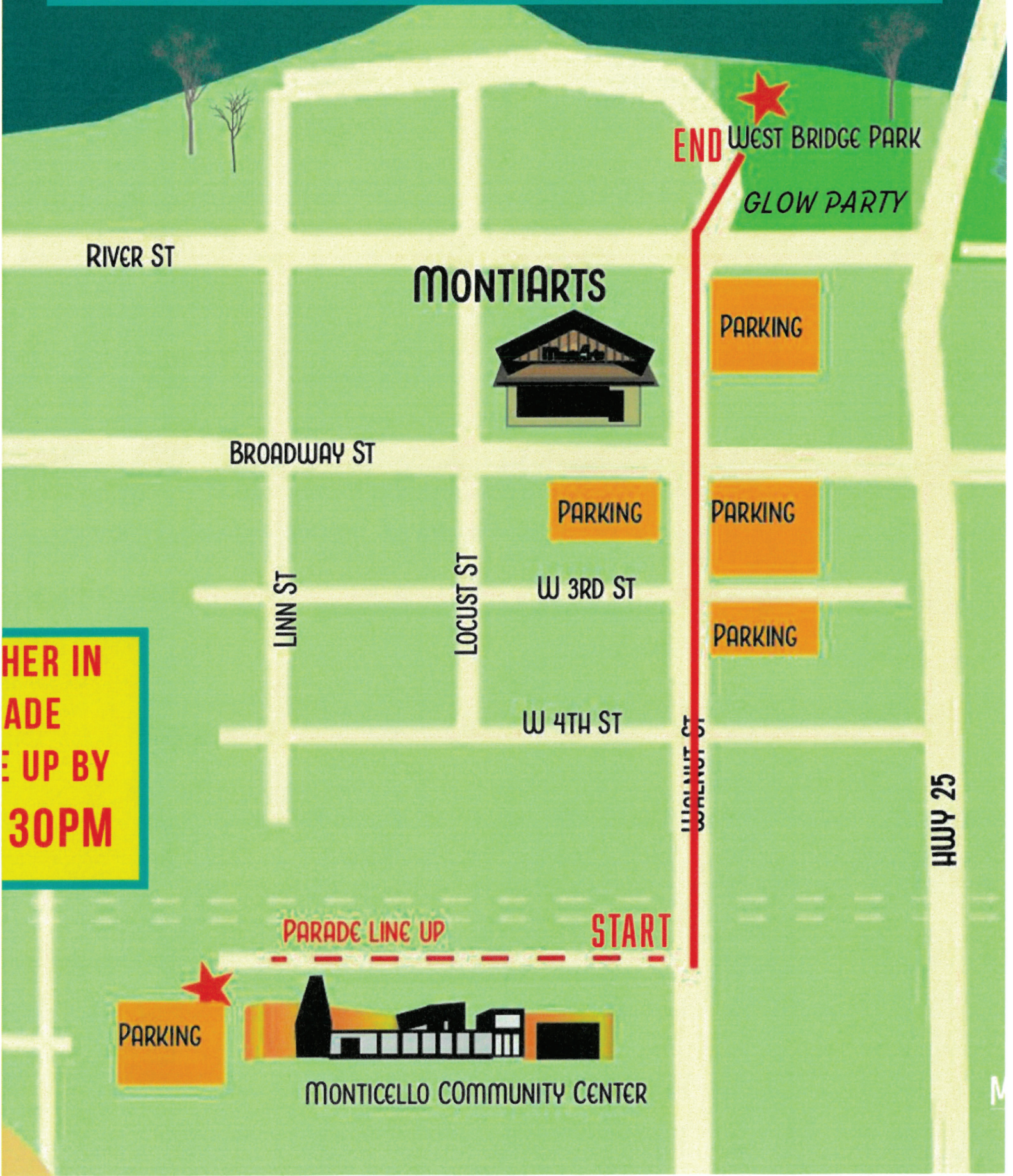

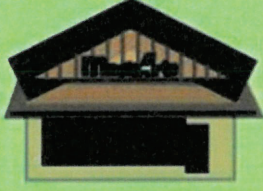

The free Freeze Your Bass Off Tournament attracts anglers from across central Minnesota and beyond. Monticello’s riverfront access positions the city as a destination for high-quality, shore-based fishing, supporting local businesses and reinforcing its identity as a hub for outdoor recreation.

Additional sponsors enhance the tournament experience, while the City offers in-kind contributions of Warehouse and expo space, staff support, and promotion to help keep the event free and community focused.

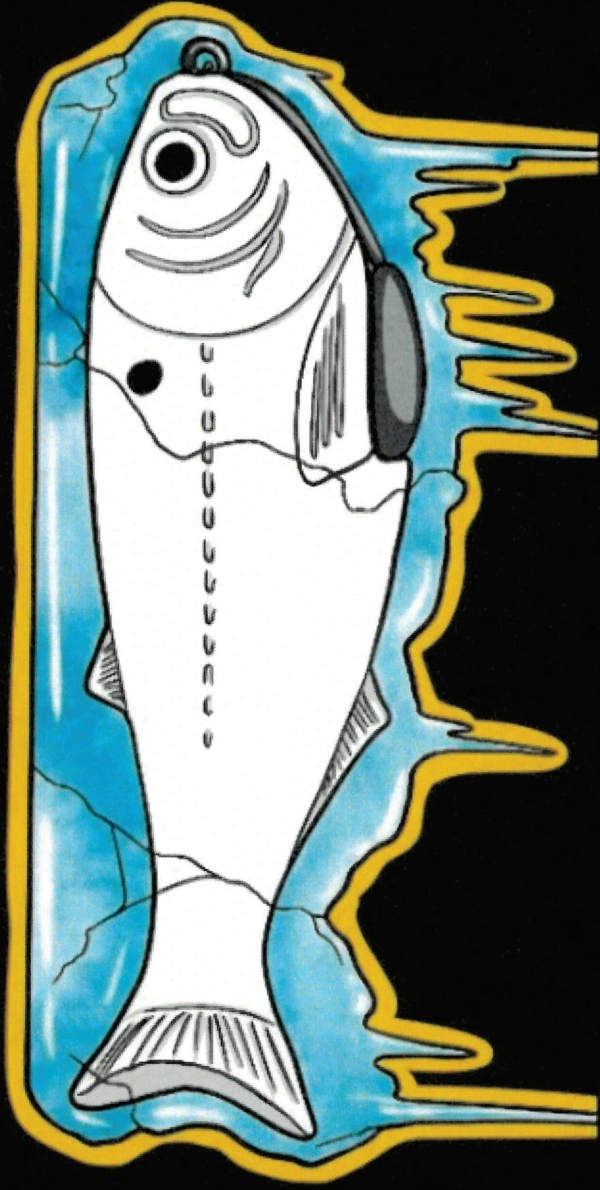

Twin Cities Land Development, the applicant for the Haven Ridge West Preliminary Plat and Planned Unit Development (PUD), has requested a 120-day extension of the City’s decision deadline for their final plat and final stage PUD application.

Since the prior extension was granted, the applicant has continued to address matters related to final plat configuration and ownership timing for the proposed development. In their request, Twin Cities Land Development indicated their intent to proceed with the project in manner consistent with all prior approvals.

The approved preliminary plat for Haven Ridge West provides an additional 298 single-family residential units, including a range of lot sizes and home products. The plat also includes construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Fallon Avenue and 85th Street. The roundabout right-of-way and associated trunk infrastructure within the proposed Haven Ridge West represent important improvements that will support service to the City’s growth area to the south and west, including the proposed Monticello Industrial/Monticello Tech site.

The City’s Subdivision Ordinance requires submission of a complete final plat application within 360 days of preliminary plat approval. The Preliminary Plat and Development Stage PUD for Haven Ridge West were approved on August 26, 2024, concurrent with rezoning. Accordingly, the preliminary plat approval was set to expire on August 21, 2025. Twin Cities Land Development submitted its final plat and final stage PUD application materials in April 2025, meeting the required 360-day submission deadline.

The Subdivision Ordinance and state law require the City to act within 60 days of receipt of a complete final plat application and within a maximum of 120 days for the Development Stage and Final Stage PUD processes. Through its extension request, the applicant has authorized an extension to the statutory timeline for the City’s decision, as permitted by law.

The City Attorney has also recommended that the City formally consider an extension of the preliminary plat approval and the City's decision timeline for the final plat in order to fully satisfy the intent of the following subdivision ordinance provision.

(7) Approval of a preliminary plat shall be null and void unless within 360 days after receiving the last required approval of the preliminary plat there shall be submitted to the Zoning Administrator a final plat or plats for all or a portion of the approved preliminary plat in accordance with the conditions upon which approval was granted by the City Council. An extension from this requirement may be granted by the Council upon the reception of a request for extension. An extension shall be requested in writing and filed with the city at least 14 days before the voidance of the approved preliminary plat. There shall be no charge for the filing of such request. The request for extension shall state facts showing a good faith attempt was made to meet the final plat submission requirement. Such request shall be presented to the Council for a decision.

In addition, the City's Zoning Ordinance requires applicants for a Planned Unit Development to submit a final stage PUD plan and final plat that conform to the approved Development Stage PUD and preliminary plat within 60 days of Development Stage PUD approval, consistent with M.S. §15.99. Applicants may request an extension of up to six months from the Community Development Department. Twin Cities Land Development submitted a 6-month extension request to April, 2025. The April application for final plat and final stage PUD satisfied this requirement and the applicant is not requesting the Council extension for the decision on the final stage PUD to coincide with the final plat decision.

- I. **Budget Impact:** None. The applicant's escrow covers review expenses related to the plat.
- II. **Staff Workload Impact:** Minimal; limited to review of request and preparation of report.
- III. **Comprehensive Plan Impact:** The extensions support a project previously found consistent with the 2040 Plan. The proposed plat and PUD are consistent with the land use guidance provided within the Monticello 2040 plan for the Low Density and Estate Residential areas of this project. The proposed project provides a variety of housing options consistent with the 2040 policy for Neighborhood Diversity & Life-Cycle Housing's policy for "sustaining a diverse array of neighborhood character and housing types" and includes areas of conservation design and neighborhood focus.

STAFF RECOMMENDED ACTION

City staff recommend approving the extension for the preliminary plat approval and for the final plat and final stage PUD decision for Haven Ridge West. Extension of these timelines is consistent with the prior approvals and facilitates work to complete the Haven Ridge West plans and development contract, including the public infrastructure associated with the project.

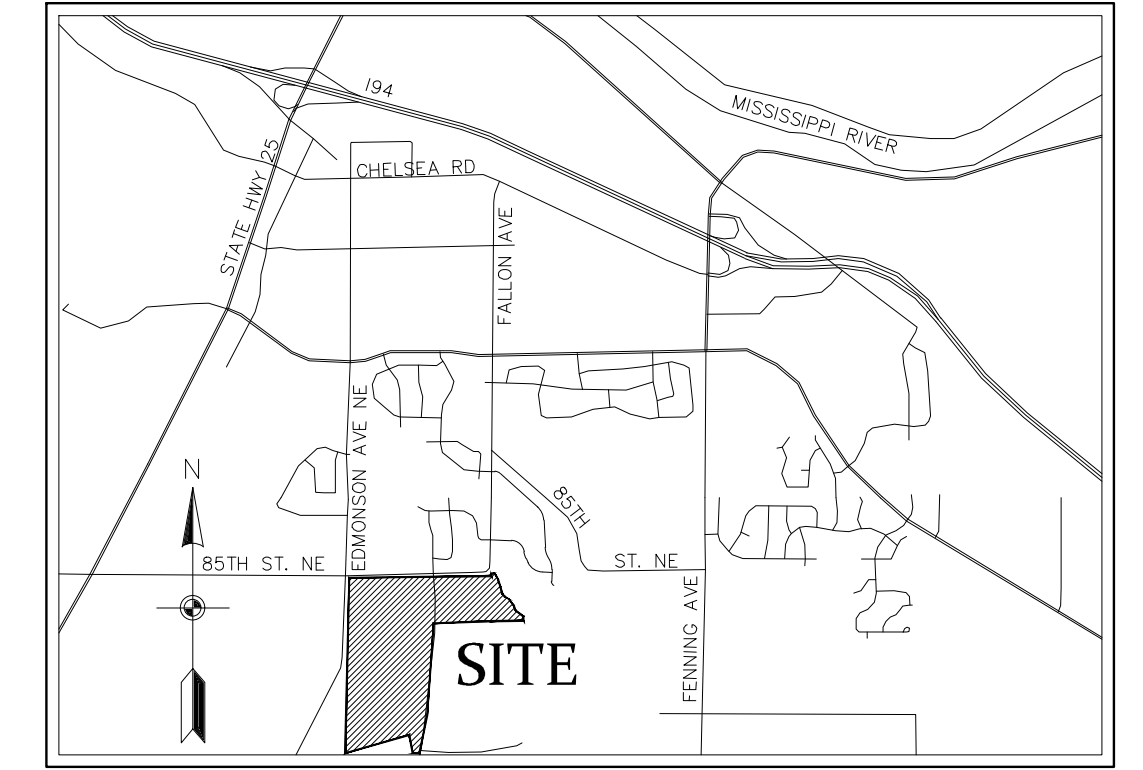

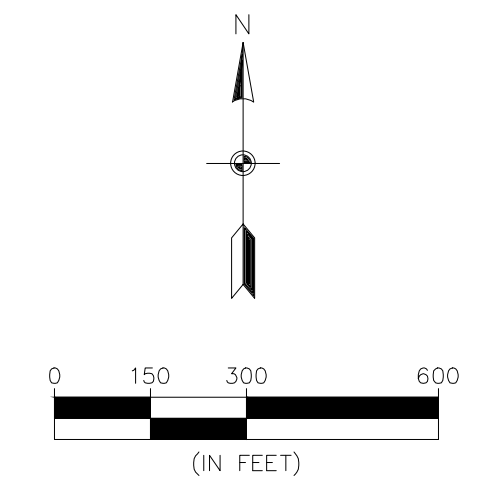

§ 152.027 PROCEDURE FOR FINAL PLAT.

(A) *Filing.*

(1) After the preliminary plat has been approved, the final plat shall be submitted for review as set forth in the divisions which follow. The city may agree to review the preliminary and final plat simultaneously. The final plat shall incorporate all changes, modifications, and revisions required by the city. Otherwise, it shall strictly conform to the approved preliminary plat.

(2) The application for final plat shall be accompanied by electronic and print copies of a preliminary plat and supportive information in conformity with requirements of this chapter and application checklists.

(B) *Approval of the City Council.*

(1) The final plat shall be submitted to the Zoning Administrator for distribution to the City Council and appropriate city staff. The city staff shall examine the final plat and prepare a recommendation to the Council. The Council shall certify final approval within 60 days if the applicant has complied with all conditions and requirements of applicable regulations and conditions and requirements of the preliminary plat approval.

(2) If approved, the final plat and development agreement shall be approved by resolution, which resolution shall provide for the acceptance of all agreements for basic improvements, public dedication, and other requirements as indicated by the City Council. If disapproved, the grounds for any refusal to approve a plat shall be set forth in the proceedings of the Council and reported to the person or persons applying for such approval.

(C) *Development agreement.* Before a final plat is approved by the City Council and prior to recording or registering a final plat, the owner or subdivider of the land covered by the plat shall execute and submit to the Council an agreement, which shall be binding on his, her, or their heirs, personal representatives, and assigns, which embodies the terms and conditions of the approval given by the Council, including, but not limited to, requirements set forth in this chapter and which controls the installation of all required improvements. The agreement will require all improvements in compliance with approved engineering standards and applicable regulations. Said development agreement shall provide for the supervision and inspection of the construction by the City Engineer and shall provide for the fees and securities in connection to the improvements.

(D) *Existing special assessments.* When any existing special assessments which have been levied against the property described are to be divided and allocated to the respective lots in the proposed plat, city staff shall:

- (1) Estimate the clerical cost of preparing a revised assessment role;
- (2) File the same with the County Auditor; and
- (3) Make such division and allocation.

(E) *Recording final plat.*

(1) If the final plat and development agreement are approved by the City Council, the applicant shall record them with the County Recorder within 100 days after the approval or approval of the final plat shall be considered void, unless a request for a time extension is submitted in writing and approved by the Council. The applicant shall, immediately upon recording, furnish the Zoning Administrator with a print and reproducible tracing of the final plat showing evidence of the recording.

(2) A final plat will not be released by the city for recording purposes until the applicant has satisfied applicable ministerial requirements of this chapter, including payment of fees, execution of a developer's agreement, deposit of surety, letters of credit, Mylar copies of the final plat, easement and deed documents, and all other requirements of approval by resolution.

(3) No building permits shall be let for construction of any structure on any lot in the plat until the construction plans have been approved by the city, the city has received evidence of the plat and development agreement being recorded by the county and the provisions of the subdivision's development agreement have been satisfactorily met.

(F) *Recording of multiple-phased plats.* If a preliminary plat is final platted in stages, unless otherwise provided for in the development contract, all stages must be final platted into lots and blocks (not outlots) within three years after the preliminary plat has been approved by the City Council. If the final plats are not approved and recorded in accordance with this time frame, the preliminary plat approval shall be considered void, unless a request for time extension is submitted in writing and approved by the Council prior to the expiration of the three-year period.

(G) *Extension.* Within 30 days of the deadline of recording of the final plat, the applicant may file with the Zoning Administrator a written request that said deadline be extended six months beyond the date the extension is granted. The Zoning Administrator shall place the request on the agenda of a regularly scheduled City Council meeting to be held within 30 days of the extension filing if in their opinion no change has occurred in any land use restriction or the Comprehensive Plan, or any other official control affecting the use, development density, lot size, lot layout, or dedication or platting required or permitted by the preliminary plat.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

The Meadowbrook plat includes developer-installed public improvements including streets, sidewalks, signage, mailboxes, streetlights, and public utilities. Construction of the improvements was recently completed, and they have been inspected, tested and approved for compliance with the City’s standard specifications by the Engineering and Public Works Departments.

In accordance with the development agreement, the developer provided financial security to ensure completion of the public improvements. Staff now recommend that the City Council accept the public utilities portion of the public improvements and reduce the letter of credit. The developer’s contractor has submitted a two-year warranty bond for the public utilities, which expire in February 2028.

A portion of the securities for grading, streets, curb, sidewalk, trail and landscaping will be retained until all vegetation is fully established and the related warranties are complete. Once the street wear course has been installed, Council will be asked to accept the sidewalk, trail, curb and street improvements, at which time a two-year warranty bond will be required from the contractor.

Motion to authorize purchase of a 2027 Volvo VHD tandem axel cab and chassis from Nuss Truck & Equipment equipped with Force America controls, a dump body and Falls plow equipment from Towmaster and purchase of associated auto greaser from Lubecore MN for a net cost of \$345,499.22 and to declare the current Truck 116 as surplus.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

The 2026 budget includes \$400,000 for the purchase of a new plow truck. Staff request authorization to purchase a 2027 Volvo VHD tandem axle cab and chassis from Nuss Truck and Equipment of Mankato, MN outfitted with additional equipment as listed below. The final cost includes the trade-in value for the existing plow truck being replaced.

The new truck will replace the City's 2012 Mack Granite hook/plow truck. Although the City operated a 2008 Sterling plow truck that is older, staff recommend replacing the 2012 Mack truck first due to ongoing reliability issues and downtime. The 2012 truck has had ongoing mechanical and electrical issues, including failures related to its first-generation diesel exhaust system and more recent computer and wiring failures. Replacement parts are difficult to obtain, resulting in increased downtime and repair costs. Over \$50,000 in repairs beyond normal maintenance have been required, including \$14,983.98 for recent computer and wiring harness repairs.

Two cab and chassis were evaluated through the state contract: Mack and Volvo. The Volvo was \$122.32 more expensive than the Mack; however, the City currently owns two Volvo trucks with positive performance history, and operators prefer the Volvo cab configuration. Based on these factors, staff recommend purchasing the Volvo.

There are two companies in Minnesota that outfit plow equipment. Due to past performance experience, staff recommend outfitting the truck with Towmaster equipment. Towmaster has outfitted all but one of the plows and has the strongest results. Installation of the plow equipment is anticipated in 2027.

Finally, staff recommend utilizing the Lubecore auto-greaser to maintain fleet consistency and prevent having to stock different styles of grease cartridges.

- I. **Budget Impact:** The 2026 Central Equipment Fund budget includes \$400,000 for the replacement of one plow truck. The Towmaster plow equipment will not be installed until 2027, therefore the 2027 Central Equipment Fund budget will reflect that cost.
- II. **Staff Workload Impact:** Improve efficiency with time, vehicle failure and safety.
- III. **Comprehensive Plan Impact:** N/A

STAFF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommend purchase of the 2027 Volvo and associated equipment as noted and declaring the Truck 116 2012 Mack as surplus.

Motion to approve Change Order #1 in the amount of \$40,487.38 with OMG Midwest, Inc as part of the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION

- July 10, 2023:** Council approved the preparation of a feasibility report for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project and approved a contract with Hakanson Anderson to provide engineering in the amount of \$235,500.
- May 13, 2024:** Council approved the purchase of permanent and temporary easements for the Edmonson and School Boulevard Roundabout.
- July 8, 2024:** Council approved the submission of a Public Interest Finding with MnDOT for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project.
- July 22, 2024:** Council approved the purchase of right-of-way for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project.
- September 9, 2024:** Council approved restricting on-street parking on School Boulevard from Highway 25 to Country Lane.
- October 14, 2024:** Council approved the feasibility study and set public hearing for November 12, 2024.

Council approved an Advance Construction Agreement with MnDOT.
- November 12, 2024:** Council approved ordering the improvements for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project.
- November 25, 2024:** Council approved plans, specifications, and authorization to bid for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project.

January 13, 2025: Council approved accepting bids and awarding the contract to OMG Midwest, Inc. for the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements project in the amount of \$3,157,869.76.

May 27, 2025: Council approved an agreement with Xcel Energy for the relocation of a transmission line pole.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

The City received grant funding to partially fund the construction of two roundabouts along School Boulevard: one at the Edmonson Avenue intersection and the other at the Cedar Street intersection. Both intersections were previously controlled by four-way stop signs, and the traffic analysis completed as part of The Pointes at Cedar Master Plan recommended roundabouts to improve safety and traffic efficiency.

During construction, it was determined that boulevard irrigation systems would be impacted due to adjustments in the curb line and placement of the new sidewalks and trails. While the original contract included a small allowance for irrigation repair, no record plans were available for the privately owned irrigation systems located within the boulevard. As a result, the necessary repairs were completed on a force account basis in accordance with MnDOT specifications. The attached change order provides a detailed list of the labor and materials needed to repair the damaged irrigation systems.

- I. **Budget Impact:** The 2025 budget included \$3,400,000 for this project, about \$3.1M of which has been spent. Even though it is a new year, the work was completed in 2025 and will be accrued back to that budget year. Project costs of \$1,485,000 will be reimbursed by federal grant funds, \$380,000 will be transferred from the Street Lighting Fund, and the remaining costs will be paid for out of the Capital Projects Fund.
- II. **Staff Workload Impact:** N/A
- III. **Comprehensive Plan Impact:** The Pointes at Cedar Master Plan is an adopted appendix to the Monticello 2040 Vision + Comprehensive Plan; the document calls for both roundabouts to improve safety and efficiency along the collector roadway of School Boulevard.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION

January 23, 2023: Council approved advancing \$1,991,167.15 in Municipal State Aid funds.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

Any municipality eligible to receive State Aid funding may advance or “borrow” State Aid construction funds up to four times its annual construction allotment from its State Aid account. For 2026, the City received a total of \$1,006,255 in State Aid funding, which includes \$251,564 for maintenance, used to help support street department operations, and \$754,691 for construction. Based on this construction allotment, the City is eligible to advance up to \$3,018,764.

The City previously advanced State Aid funds in 2023, and \$549,944.11 of those funds received remain outstanding. After accounting for this amount, \$2,468,819.89 is available for advancement.

To be eligible to receive reimbursement for state aid construction funds, projects must be located on a designated State Aid route, reviewed, and approved by MnDOT to ensure compliance with all State Aid requirements. Several past projects that were completed have unused balances totaling \$2,255,717.92 as outlined below:

While \$2,468,819.89 is available for advancement, the full amount cannot be utilized due to the lack of State Aid eligible projects at this time. The portion of the School Boulevard Intersection Improvements Project that was not funded by grant funds will be eligible for State Aid advancement once that project is accepted and approved by MnDOT.

Motion to adopt Resolution 2026-07 approve MnDOT Cooperative Construction Agreement No. 1061836 for ongoing maintenance and responsibilities related to the TH 25 Bridge (Bridge No. 86803) reconstruction project.

REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND

MnDOT plans to construct a project on Trunk Highway 25 (TH 25) at Bridge No. 86803 over I-94 in 2027. The project includes bridge redecking, bituminous surfacing, approach panels, sidewalk improvements, lighting replacement, and aesthetic enhancements.

As part of the project, MnDOT has requested that the City of Monticello assume long-term ownership and maintenance responsibilities for several components once construction is completed.

1. Sidewalk System Maintenance: The City will maintain all sidewalk elements over Bridge No. 86803, including:
 - Snow and ice removal
 - Debris removal
 - Crack repair and patching
 - Pedestrian ramp upkeep
 - Grass boulevard mowing
2. Lighting System Ownership & Maintenance: The City will own and maintain the aesthetic bridge lighting system with responsibilities including:
 - LED relamping and replacement
 - Pole and luminaire repairs
 - Electrical cabinet and distribution maintenance
 - Conduit repairs and wiring replacement
 - Utility locates

- Payment of all electrical service costs for the system
 - Aesthetic Feature Maintenance
3. Aesthetic Feature Maintenance: MnDOT will add cast-in-place “Monticello” lettering on the west barrier as well as swan emblems on ornamental railing panels. The City will maintain the new features, including:
- Painting
 - Graffiti removal
 - Replacement of emblems
 - Any repairs required to keep aesthetic elements in an acceptable condition

These responsibilities are consistent with updated standard MnDOT cooperative agreements when cities request enhanced aesthetics or pedestrian accommodations.

- I. **Budget Impact:** There is no local match expected for the project. Ongoing operation and maintenance costs are estimated to be around \$15,000 annually, which would be paid from a combination of the Street Lighting Improvement Fund and General Fund.
- II. **Staff Workload Impact:** The existing sidewalk over the bridge is maintained by MnDOT, including snow removal. The updated agreement will shift responsibility to City crews. The other maintenance agreement components noted will also be added responsibilities, though likely less frequently impacting workload.
- III. **Comprehensive Plan Impact:** Chapter 4, Mobility and Connectivity, supports improvements like redecking the Hwy 25 bridge over I-94 emphasizing safe, efficient transportation infrastructure that maintains regional mobility and enhances long-term corridor performance. Chapter 7, Community Character, Design, and the Arts, encourages aesthetic enhancements to public infrastructure, meaning that incorporating visual design features on the bridge aligns with the city’s goals to strengthen community identity and create attractive gateways.

STAFF RECOMMENDED ACTION

City staff recommend approving the Cooperative Construction and Maintenance Agreement with MnDOT.

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State") and the City of Monticello acting through its City Council ("City").

Recitals

1. The State will perform Bridge No. 86803 redecking and repairs, grading, bituminous surfacing, approach panels, sidewalks, and lighting construction and other associated construction upon, along, and adjacent to Trunk Highway No. 25 from Reference Point 67+01.085 to 68+00.092 over I-94 according to State-prepared plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 8605-58 (TH 25=025) ("Project"); and
2. The State has included in its contract an aesthetic lighting system on the barriers of Bridge No. 86803 and the City is willing to maintain the lighting system after completion of the construction. The City will also continue to own and maintain the other two light units south of the bridge from this lighting system that aren't being replaced; and
3. The State has included in its contract bridge aesthetic features such as cast-in-place lettering "Monticello" (community entrance sign) on the outside of the west facing barrier and swan features in the bridge ornamental railing on top of the barriers, and the City is willing to maintain these aesthetic features after completion of the construction; and
4. The City will assume maintenance responsibilities for the sidewalk system over Bridge No. 86803; and
5. Minnesota Statutes § 161.20, subdivision 2 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to make arrangements with and cooperate with any governmental authority for the purposes of constructing, maintaining, and improving the trunk highway system.

Agreement

1. Term of Agreement; Survival of Terms; Plans; Incorporation of Exhibits

- 1.1. Effective Date.** This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all signatures required by Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- 1.2. Expiration Date.** This Agreement will expire when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled.
- 1.3. Survival of Terms.** All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 3. Maintenance by the City; 6. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; Insurance; 8. State Audits; 9. Government Data Practices; 10. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue; and 12. Force Majeure.

- 1.4. Plans, Specifications, and Special Provisions.** Plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 8605-58 (TH 25=025) are on file in the office of the Commissioner of Transportation at St. Paul, Minnesota, and incorporated into this Agreement by reference ("Project Plans").
- 1.5. Exhibits.** Exhibit "A" – Lighting, Exhibit "B" – Concrete Barrier Emblem, and Exhibit "C" – Metal Railing Swan Emblem are attached and incorporated into this agreement.

2. Construction by the State

- 2.1. Contract Award.** The State will advertise for bids and award a construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder according to the Project Plans.
- 2.2. Direction, Supervision, and Inspection of Construction.**
- A. Supervision and Inspection by the State.** The State will direct and supervise all construction activities performed under the construction contract, and perform all construction engineering and inspection functions in connection with the contract construction. All contract construction will be performed according to the Project Plans.
- B. Inspection by the City.** The construction covered under this Agreement will be open to inspection by the City. If the City believes the construction covered under this Agreement has not been properly performed or that the construction is defective, the City will inform the State District Engineer's authorized representative in writing of those defects. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will have the exclusive right to determine whether the State's contractor has satisfactorily performed the construction covered under this Agreement.
- 2.3. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.**
- A.** The State will make changes in the Project Plans and contract construction and will enter into any necessary addenda and change orders with the State's contractor that are necessary to cause the contract construction to be performed and completed in a satisfactory manner.
- B.** The City may request additional work or changes to the work in the plans as part of the construction contract. Such request will be made by an exchange of letter(s) with the State. If the State determines that the requested additional work or plan changes are necessary or desirable and can be accommodated without undue disruption to the project, the State will cause the additional work or plan changes to be made. The State reserves the right to invoice the City for the cost of any construction contract addenda and any additional City requested work and plan changes, including associated construction engineering, before the completion of the contract construction.
- 2.4. Satisfactory Completion of Contract.** The State will perform all other acts and functions necessary to cause the construction contract to be completed in a satisfactory manner. Acceptance by the State of the completed contract construction will be final, binding, and conclusive upon the City as to the satisfactory completion of the contract construction.
- 2.5. Permits.** The City will submit to the State's Utility Engineer an original permit application for all utilities owned by the City to be constructed hereunder that are upon and within the Trunk Highway Right-of-Way. Applications for permits will be made on State form "Application For Utility Permit On Trunk Highway Right-of-Way" (Form 2525).

3. Maintenance by the City

Upon completion of the project, the City will provide the following without cost or expense to the State:

- 3.1. Sidewalks.** Maintenance of any sidewalk construction, including stamped and colored concrete sidewalk (if any) and pedestrian ramps. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice, and debris removal, patching, crack repair, removing trip hazards (other than panel replacement), cross street pedestrian crosswalk markings, mowing grass boulevards (if any), and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the sidewalks in a safe, useable, and aesthetically acceptable condition.
- 3.2. Lighting.** Maintenance and ownership of the lighting facility shown in Exhibit "A" – Lighting construction. Maintenance of electrical lighting systems includes everything within the system, from the point of attachment to the power source or utility, to the last light on the feed point, including but not limited to re-lamping of lighting units or replacing of LED luminaires, repair or replacement of all damaged luminaire glassware, loose connections, luminaires when damaged or when ballasts fail, photoelectric control on luminaires, defective starter boards or drivers, damaged fuse holders, blown fuses, knocked down poles including wiring within the poles, damaged poles, pull boxes, underground wire, damaged foundations, equipment pad, installation of approved splices or replacement of wires, repair or extending of conduit, lighting cabinet maintenance including photoelectric cell, electrical distribution system, Gopher State One Call (GSOC) locates, and painting of poles and other equipment. The City will be responsible for the hook up cost and application to secure an adequate power supply to the service pad or pole and will pay all monthly electrical service expenses necessary to operate the lighting facility.
- 3.3. Bridge No. 86803 Aesthetics.** The City will perform maintenance and repair of aesthetic elements on Bridge No. 86803; this includes cast-in-place lettering "Monticello" (community entrance sign) on the outside of the west facing barrier shown in Exhibit "B" – Concrete Barrier Emblem, and swan features in the bridge ornamental railing on top of the barriers shown in Exhibit "C" – Metal Railing Swan Emblem. Maintenance and repair includes, but is not limited to, painting, graffiti removal, emblem replacement, and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the aesthetic elements in a safe, usable, and aesthetically acceptable condition.

4. Authorized Representatives

Each party's Authorized Representative is responsible for administering this Agreement and is authorized to give and receive any notice or demand required or permitted by this Agreement.

5. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Contract Complete

- 5.1. Assignment.** No party may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a written assignment agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office. The foregoing does not

prohibit the City from contracting with a third party to perform City maintenance responsibilities covered under this Agreement.

- 5.2. Amendments.** Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- 5.3. Waiver.** If a party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 5.4. Contract Complete.** This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and the City. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

6. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; Insurance

Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions, and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and will not be responsible for the acts, omissions of others, and the results thereof. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of the City. Each party is responsible for its own employees for any claims arising under the Workers Compensation Act.

7. Nondiscrimination

Provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 181.59 and of any applicable law relating to civil rights and discrimination are considered part of this Agreement.

8. State Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the City's books, records, documents, accounting procedures, and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.

9. Government Data Practices

The City and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the City under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the City or the State.

10. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue

Minnesota law governs the validity, interpretation, and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

11. Termination; Suspension

- 11.1. By Mutual Agreement.** This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties or by the State for insufficient funding as described below.
- 11.2. Termination for Insufficient Funding.** The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the performance of contract construction under the Project. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the City.

11.3. Suspension. In the event of a total or partial government shutdown, the State may suspend this Agreement and all work, activities and performance of work authorized through this Agreement.

12. Force Majeure

No party will be responsible to the other for a failure to perform under this Agreement (or a delay in performance), if such failure or delay is due to a force majeure event. A force majeure event is an event beyond a party's reasonable control, including but not limited to, unusually severe weather, fire, floods, other acts of God, labor disputes, acts of war or terrorism, or public health emergencies.

State Aid Funding Advancement

February 9, 2026

MN State Aid Funding Overview

- Municipal State Aid System (MSAS) Funding is generated from the Highway User Tax Distribution Fund (HUTDF).
 - 9% of HUTDF funds are allocated to the MSAS system.
 - HUTDF funding includes state gas tax, vehicle registration fees, and a portion of the motor vehicles sales tax.
- Cities with a population over 5,000 are eligible to receive MSAS funding.
 - In 2025, there were 155 State-Aid Cities.
- Funding is distributed 50% based on population and 50% based on need.
- Need for roadway maintenance is estimated based on traffic volumes and is calculated by the Municipal Screening Board.

MN State Aid Funding Overview

- State allots funding annually and sets it aside in an account for each jurisdiction.
- State allows Cities to request funding from their account (“advance”) up to 4 future years.

For example, in 2026, a city can request payment for:

- 1) the balance from any unused allotment in previous years as well as the current year
- 2) the future allotments from 2027-2030

MN State Aid Process

- Each year, the City certifies the maintained mileage by adding any newly constructed public roadways within the City and proposing any changes for streets to be included.
 - 20% of the total mileage of roadways maintained by the City are allowed to be included.
- When a City completes a project on an eligible street, it can request reimbursement from the State out of its “account”.
- If MSAS funds are used on a project, the street must be maintained on the State-Aid system for 25-years for a reconstruction project or 10-years for an overlay.

MN State Aid – Monticello Streets

- In 2020 an audit of the MSAS system was completed which determined that Monticello was eligible for an additional 1.8 miles in MSAS routes. Chelsea Road between CSAH 39 and Hwy 25 was added to the system with this change.
- Other recent system changes include the addition of 7th Street between Golf Course Road and Elm Street with the removal of East River Street.
 - 7th Street generated additional need in the funding formula due to having higher traffic volumes.

MN State Aid – Monticello Funding

- Monticello received an advance of state aid in 2023, which was essentially for 2023-2027's allotments (i.e. our account currently has a “negative” balance).
- Monticello previously completed projects which were paid for with city funds and still have eligible costs to be reimbursed by State Aid funding.
- Council's requested action to adopt the resolution would further “advance” the City's State Aid allotments for 2028-2030.

TH 25 and I-94 Bridge MNDOT Agreement

February 9, 2026

Agreement Overview

- MNDOT has a bridge re-decking project planned for 2027.
- Sidewalk will also be widened from 6' to 8' wide.
- Bridge will be closed for deck and sidewalk replacement.
 - 4-month estimated construction timeline
 - NB detour utilizing Broadway Street/Fenning Avenue/School Boulevard
 - SB detour utilizing Chelsea Road/Fallon Avenue /7th Street
- MNDOT cost participation policy update proposes to move construction cost participation more towards MNDOT with some maintenance items being city and county responsibilities.

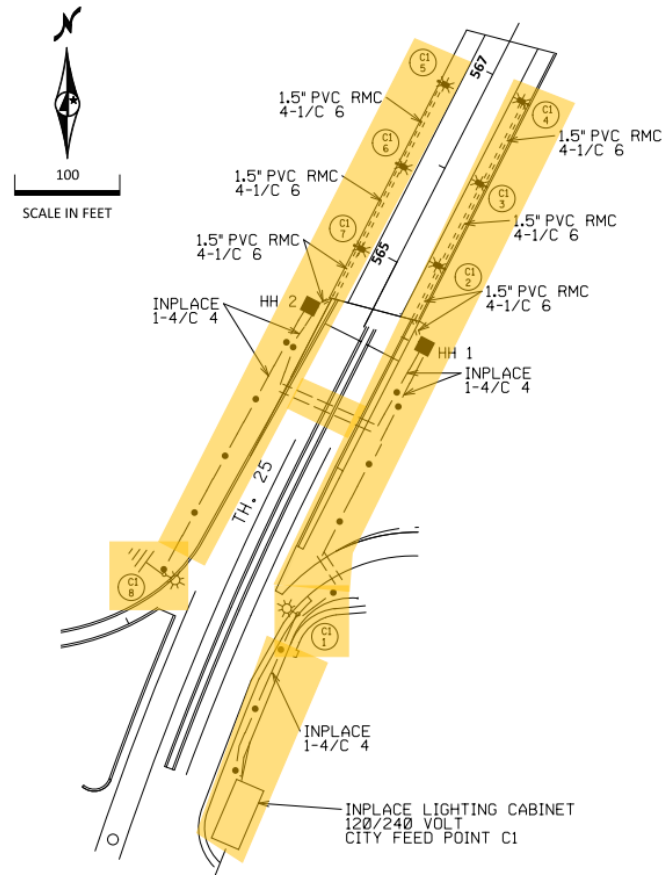
Agreement Overview

- City responsibility per this agreement includes:
 - Sidewalk maintenance
 - Snow and ice removal
 - Debris removal
 - Crack repair and patching
 - Pedestrian ramp upkeep
 - Grass boulevard mowing & other maintenance responsibilities
 - Lighting system
 - LED re-lamping and replacement
 - Pole and luminaire repairs
 - Electrical cabinet and distribution maintenance
 - Conduit repairs and wiring replacement
 - Utility locates
 - Electrical service costs

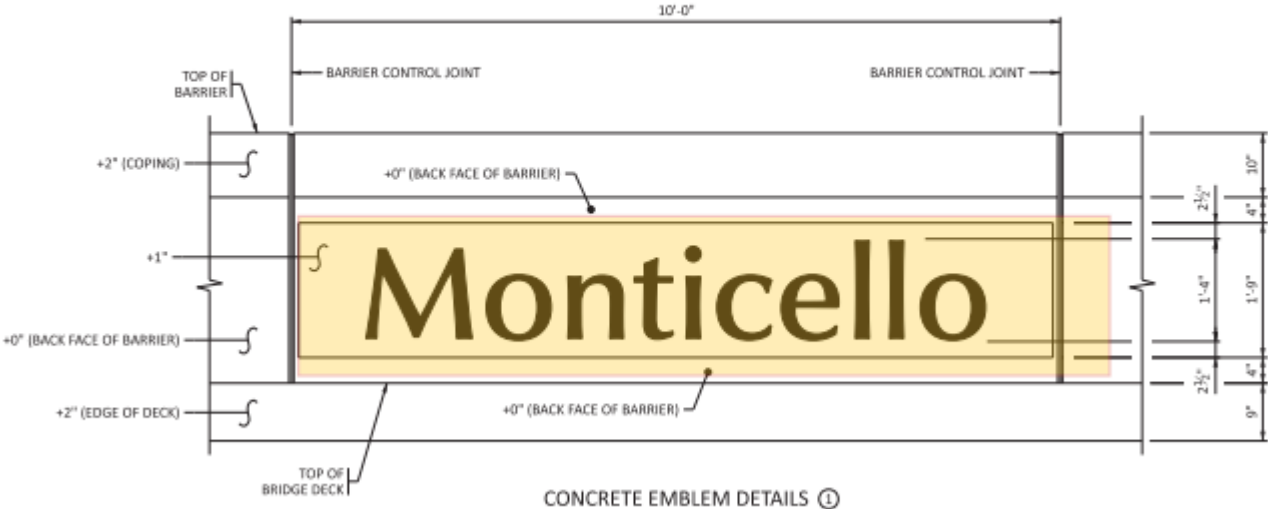
Agreement Overview

- City responsibilities continued:
 - Aesthetic features
 - Painting
 - Graffiti removal
 - Replacement and upkeep of emblems
- Costs
 - No local construction match is expected. MNDOT allows 7% of construction for aesthetic upgrades.
 - Maintenance cost, including electrical service, sidewalk repair, and maintenance, is expected at \$15,000 annually.

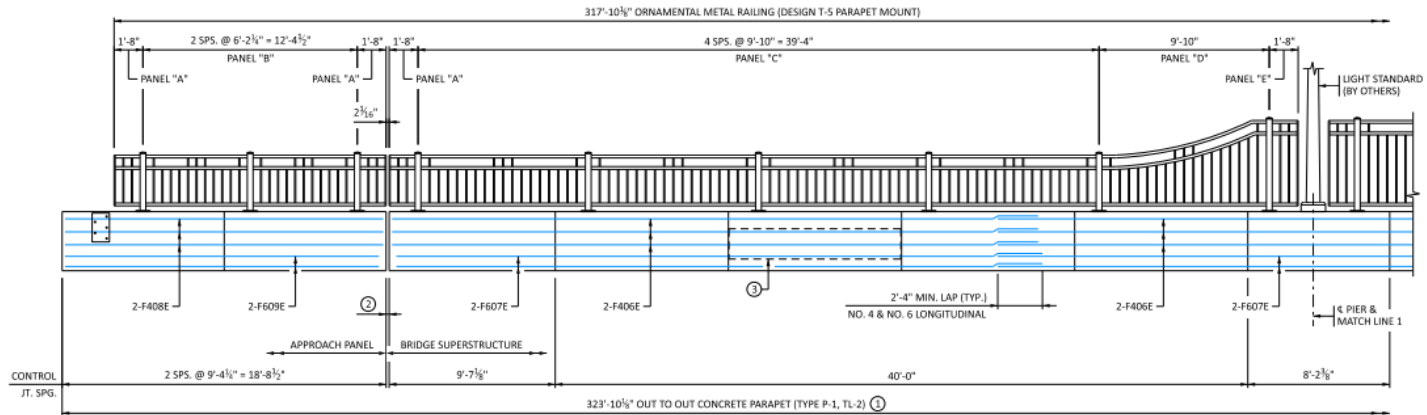

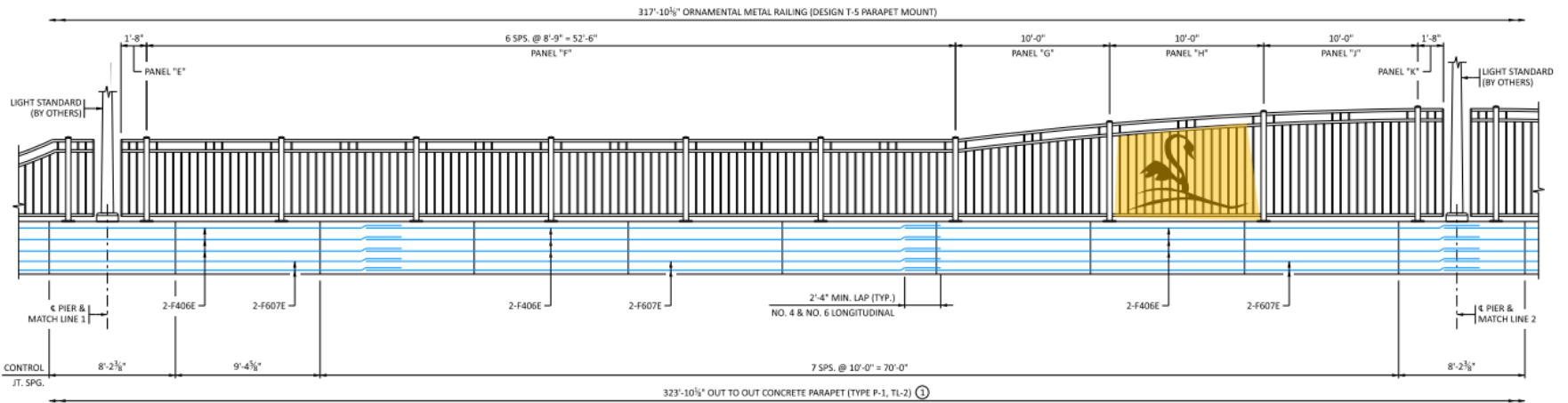

SOUTH END OF WEST BARRIER

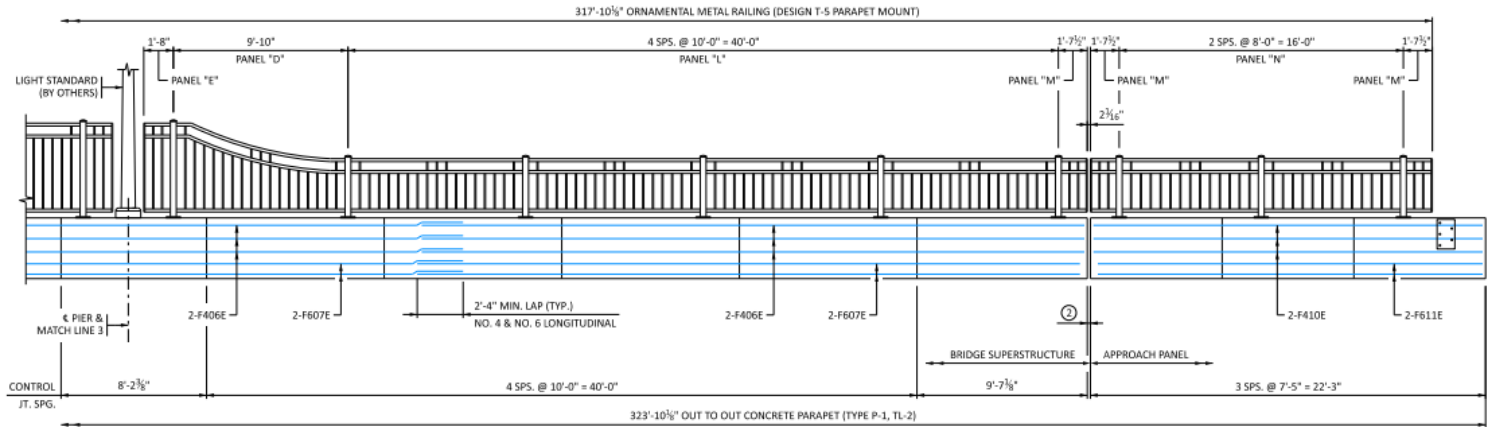
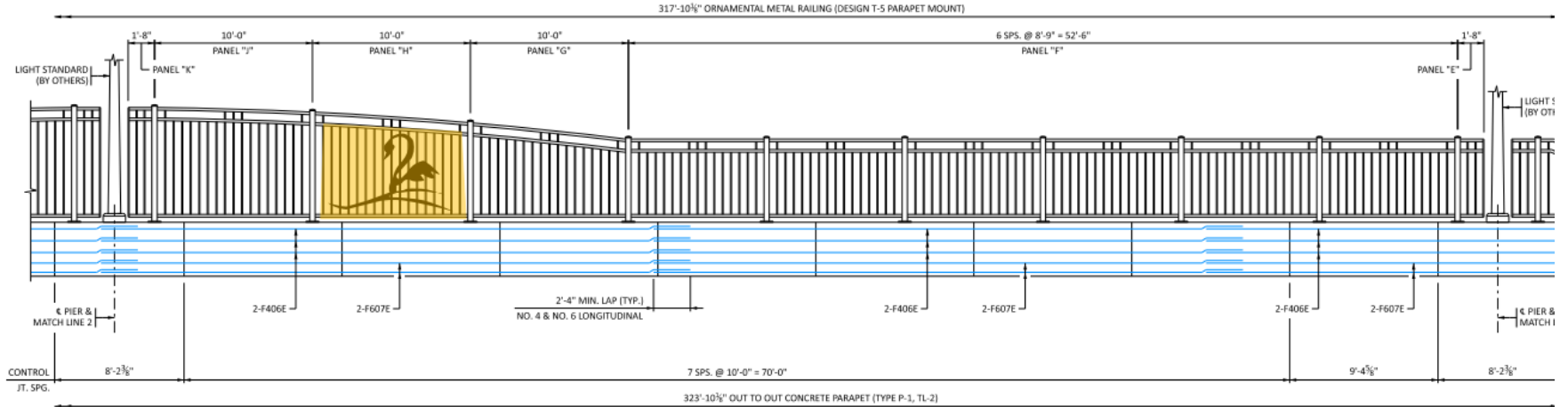


INSIDE ELEVATION CONCRETE PARAPET & ORNAMENTAL RAILING
